### New Hill Development Receives City Contribution



Recently, the Office of Economic Development presented New Hill Development Corporation a \$500,000 check as part of the city's commitment to the BEACON shared-use commercial kitchen project. The project, known as the Black Entrepreneurial Advancement and Community Opportunity Network (BEACON), will have 16 workstations available in addition to freezers and dry storage space when complete. Construction is underway at the Carlton Road facility with a late 2024 opening planned.

#### **Piedmont Pitch**



In case you missed it, there was a big kickoff a few days ago. While you would be right if you were thinking about the Super Bowl, you would be even more correct if you were thinking about last week's kickoff session for Piedmont Pitch. Over 30 people representing 25 business ideas participated in the opening session of the program's second year. Throughout the next several weeks, staff from the Central Virginia Small Business Development Center (CVSBDC) will take participants through their "Business Essentials Training" course, which is designed to

cover multiple facets of new business development and growth. Subject matter experts will provide insights and advice on topics ranging from how to create a business entity and the essentials of business finances, to understanding your target market and promoting your business idea. One-on-one sessions with a business advisor are also included and one of the key components to the Piedmont Pitch program. Individuals who complete the Business Essentials Training and advising sessions will have the opportunity to submit their business plan as part of the final pitch competition and have a shot at winning a cash prize. This year's final pitch competition will take place in April.

#### CvilleBioHub and Tech Expo

CvilleBioHub recently hosted its 1st Annual Device and Tech Expo. The event drew a capacity crowd to InBio's facility, located in the heart of Charlottesville, to see examples of the latest biomedical R&D work taking place in the region and network with likeminded individuals in the field. Charlottesville-based companies such as InBio, Luna



Labs, and Icarus Medical Innovations, were able to demonstrate advances made in particle detection technology, hyper-realistic medical training models, medical aid devices, and customized orthopedic braces. The Device and Tech Expo served to pull back the curtain so the public could see and appreciate just a portion of the innovative biomedical R&D taking place in Charlottesville and the surrounding area.

The event's timing couldn't have happened any better as it fell immediately on the heels of a **report being released** that cited successes in Charlottesville/Albemarle BioHub and its member's collaborative efforts with other regions, contributing to positive strides made in the first year of Virginia Bio-Connect, a statewide life sciences initiative.
